COURSE DESCRIPTION AND OBJECTIVES

The purpose of this course is to teach oral and maxillofacial radiology residents intermediate radiologic diagnostic and imaging features of diseases and abnormalities of the oral and maxillofacial complex.

Semester credit hours – 4.0 credit hours

By the end of this course, each student should be able to:

- Interpret disorders affecting the teeth.
- Interpret disorders affecting the jaws and cervical spine with special emphasis on cystic lesions, odontogenic tumors and fibro osseous conditions.
- Interpret radiologic features of diseases and abnormalities affecting the jaws and the oral maxillofacial complex.
- Recognize and interpret radiologic features of disorders affecting other structures in the maxillofacial region
- Recognize and interpret radiologic features of disorders affecting the TMJ
- Analyze images such as nuclear scans, ultrasound and especially CT and MR as they related to the diagnosis of disease of the oral and maxillofacial complex.
