COURSE DESCRIPTION AND OBJECTIVES

This course focuses on the supervised analysis of data previously collected for a Master of Science project. Enrollment limited to postdoctoral students in advanced education programs who have completed Research Proposal and Data Collection courses. This is the 3rd of four required core research courses for the Masters of Science in Dental Science curriculum. Registration for this course requires permission by the respective Track director for a particular Master of Science track.

Pre-requisites – MSDS 5090, and MSDS 5157/5257/or 5357, and MSDS 6357/MSDS 6657.

Semester credit hours – 2

By the end of this course, each student should be able to:

- Appropriately analyze previously collected research data .
- Explain the data analysis procedures to peers and faculty.

COURSE ORGANIZATION

The main teaching modalities used in this course include:

- 1) Conference and correspondence with Thesis Committee Chair and Members
- 2) Faculty-guided, independent study
- 3) Attendance at thesis defense of other students
