BIOC 0003 – Scientific Writing Fall 2017

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As the class usually only involves a few student, the time for meeting will be organized to accommodate the students' schedule. Class will meet once a week in the conference area of 426B once per week for 1-2 hours. The objective of the course will be to write a paper based on data from the student, but enhanced with hypothetical results to complete the manuscript. The format of J. Biol. Chem., or the journal to which you are likely to submit the article, will be followed.

DESCRIPTION of F-TROOP: The IIMS offers F-Troop, a hands-on writing workshop targeted to preand postdoctoral trainees who are working to prepare an application for an individual NRSA Fellowship (F Awards, including F30, F31, or F32) for submission to the NIH. Equivalent fellowship applications to other funding agencies are also encompassed by this program.
